PRESIDENTIAL ADDRESS*

To the 143rd Annual Convention of the Theosophical Society (TS) Adyar, 31 December 2018

I AM very happy to warmly welcome all of you to this 143rd International Convention at our Adyar international headquarters, and I wish you a very pleasant and inspiring time while you are here. Let us rise to invoke the blessings of our elder Brethren, who are ever ready to guide and help those who are unselfishly dedicated to the good of other living beings:

May those who are the embodiments of Love Immortal bless with their help and guidance this Society, founded to be a channel for their work. May They inspire it with their Wisdom, strengthen it with their Power, and energize it with their activity.

I am now pleased to open this 143rd Annual Convention of the TS.

Since the original founding of the Theosophical Society (TS) 143 years ago this movement has spread to more than 70 countries in the world. More importantly, it has affected thought and values globally. The core ideas of Unity, multi-dimensionality, omnipresent intelligence, self-responsibility, and spiritual evolution have become part of the fabric of global thought in ways both subtle and obvious. Although much of current affairs would suggest a heightened sense of separateness and denial of the fact of Oneness, the principles have become firmly rooted in human consciousness and will necessarily unfold. Our role as members of the TS in this unfoldment is to determine whether they are realized gracefully, or accompanied by the turbulence that much of current behaviour would indicate.

As an organization, the TS came into being to serve humanity in the deepest possible manner. Many organizations in the world are here to help in a variety of ways — to provide food, medical care, shelter, religious optimism, financial aid. While every level of compassionate response is needed, ultimately none of the causes of suffering can be

addressed on their own level. Food, money, shelter, and so on, do not affect the root cause of social, and even physical imbalance. Although the TS's work has been described as a "forlorn hope", it is the *only* hope. Until as a human family we loosen the inherited conviction of our separateness, we will continue the cycle of aggression, competition, and dissatisfaction that is currently engulfing us.

Throughout the TS's history we have been blessed with insightful members and dynamic leaders. As if speaking with one voice they have continually emphasized the requirement that we assume responsibility for our own unfoldment. In the absence of some grounding in the experience of Oneness, we have little to give. While this self-unfoldment is a must, the deeper direction is toward a nucleus of awakened individuals capable of expressing unity in action. It is only "through the soothing influence of brotherhood" as contemplated by the TS's inner founders that the instinctual expression of human nature can be prevented from ever increasing levels of harm. In a practical sense this means that we as members of the TS have to continue to learn how to work together, regardless of personal likes and dislikes.

When the TS was founded one had to be a visionary to have a genuine sense of global interconnection. Today the fact of interconnection is continually, often painfully, present. Anyone with a mobile phone is in touch from moment to moment with currents in the world. The relative ease of communication and travel has made aspects of our work more possible. Whereas in the recent past our groups and Sections had to work in relative isolation, today new levels of cooperation are possible. At the international level, for the last three years, we have been meeting to develop a working nucleus to plan and implement a spectrum of projects.

The work we are attempting is global, but requires the focused efforts of local members and groups. Outwardly, circumstances and conditions are continually changing, but the collective tendencies of humanity move much more slowly. In this time of ever-increasing urban concentration, where the stabilizing influence of Nature's rhythms is becoming less available to most, we are faced with a challenge. How do we create islands of peace and stability in the midst of the swirling, irregular currents of modern life? How do we expose those who are searching, perhaps without even knowing it, to these alternative possibilities?

There is no set answer to these questions, but there are examples. In India for 136 years the centre at Adyar has been a source of spiritual focus and quiet; in the United States the Olcott National Headquarters has been a similar example; in Finland, Australia, Italy, New Zealand, Cuba, Israel, Brazil, and numerous other places around the world their centres have demonstrated the magnetic quality of cooperative effort toward deepening awareness.

The highlight of this year was the 11th World Congress of the Theosophical Society (TS) held in Singapore from 4 to 8 August, with the theme "Consciousness, Contemplation, Commitment: The Future Is Now". This historic event was organized for the first time in Asia with 173 delegates from 24 countries. It was held in the Conference Hall of Ramada Singapore at Zhongshan Park, I gave the opening address and Marcos de Resende gave the keynote speech on the theme. That evening I gave a lecture on "A Theosophy for Tomorrow", and also gave a lecture on "The Intuitive Mind" in a public auditorium on 5 August, with more than 300 attending. Other Congress lectures and workshops were given by several General Secretaries, officers of the TS worldwide, and the President of Singapore Lodge, Mr Chong Sanne, who led a team of members from the Lodge who worked hard and efficiently to organize this Congress. The 4th Theosophical Order of Service (TOS) International Conference was also organized in Singapore following the World Congress from 9 to 10 August, with 67 members from 18 countries attending. Nancy Secrest, TOS International Secretary, chaired the session and I gave the opening speech.

Continuing with the Indo-Pacific region, I inaugurated the 126th Indian Section Convention at the Adyar Theatre on 1 January, chaired by the international Vice-President, Dr Deepa Padhi. The "State of the Indian Section Address" followed, along with a slide presentation by the General Secretary, Mr Pradeep Gohil. The Indian Section Council elected Mr V. Narayanan, uncontested, as Treasurer for 2018-2019. There was a decrease of 250 members in the Indian Section as of 30 September.

I attended the North India Study Camp held from 6 to 8 October at the Indian Section Headquarters in Varanasi on "The Process of Unfoldment: An Education of the Soul" and gave a public lecture on "The Importance of the Centre" held in the evening of the first day. I spoke to the TOS group members in the Workers' Training Programme on 9

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October. The 95th South India Theosophical Conference was organized in Adyar from 30 March to 1 April on "Illumination Must Come from Within". From six Federations 118 delegates attended the Conference, which started with the welcome address by the international Secretary Ms Marja Artamaa. A study camp was organized at the Himalayan Study Centre, Bhowali, from April 13 to 19 by the Indian Section on the topic "Glimpses into *The Secret Doctrine*", which was directed by Mr U. S. Pandey. A National Youth Study Camp was also held in Bhowali from 25 to 27 May by the Indian Section with 44 participants from various parts of India, which was directed by Mr Shikhar Agnihotri and Ms Varsha Patel.

A TOS camp was organized in the Bhowali Centre from 29 to 31 May on the theme "Working Towards the Future" with 36 active members of TOS from different Indian regions, including Mrs Deepa Padhi, international Vice-President, Nancy Secrest, TOS international Secretary, and Marja Artamaa, international Secretary.

At the International Headquarters in Adyar the renovation work of Blavatsky Bungalow and the Headquarters Building area continued at a steady pace. In the Archives and Museum department, 30 research scholars used the facilities, coming in person or requesting scanned materials by email. The Convention archival exhibition on "Dr Annie Besant — A Hundred Years Ago", inaugurated by international Vice-President Dr Deepa Padhi, was well received. The Archives team consists of Mrs V. Vedavathi, Mr Mohan Mani and Ms Jaishree Kannan. Mr Bernd Jesse's contribution as a volunteer was very much appreciated.

In 1886 President-Founder Col H. S. Olcott established the now world-reputed Adyar Library and Research Centre. Dr T. Narayanan Kutty is the current Director and Prof. C. A. Shinde the Chief Librarian, with 14 supporting staff. The automation and digitalization of Hinduism and Theosophy books was completed. A total of 38,000 books were checked for automation work and those in bad condition were scanned. They were rearranged in the shelves and listed on a printout available in the reading room. In addition to the regular Library display we had a year-long special exhibition of photographs on "Flora and Fauna of Adyar", taken by Prof. A. Chandrasekharan. Over 1,050 visitors, including many from Chennai schools, came to see it. The Library was used by 1,200

registered reader members and 280 borrowers (out of 760) used the Library this year. About 3,500 books were read in the reading room, 400 books were borrowed, and 1,000 manuscripts consulted.

The School of the Wisdom began their courses in Adyar in November, with Mr Jon Knebel, from the TS in America, covering much material on the meaning of the Theosophical Movement. In December, the Ven. Olande Ananda, from Sri Lanka, discussed the difference between concept and reality, an ongoing, endless process on the spiritual path. In January, Mr Vicente Hao Chin, Jr, went deeply into the process of self-awareness, leading to self-transformation, the responsibility of every human being. Dr José Foglia introduced the anatomical background of our spiritual journey, pointing out directions for investigation if we are to be true to our real selves.

The Theosophical Order of Service (TOS) is present in 35 of the 55 countries where the TS is active. It is headed by me as ex-officio President, and an International Secretary (IS), currently Ms Nancy Secrest, who is appointed by the President. The IS administers and coordinates the TOS from wherever she is located, currently in Adyar, India.

While in India from mid-August to late October, I travelled to Dombivali, speaking for the Bombay Federation members, near Mumbai. In Bhowali I participated in an Indian Section goal-setting meeting at the Himalayan Theosophical Centre, and spoke at the Karnataka Federation annual conference in Bangalore.

The Vice-President, Dr Deepa Padhi, attended the Foundation Day commemoration on 17 November as the Chief Guest of the Utkal Theosophical Federation, Odisha, speaking on "The Relevance of Theosophy in the Present Day". She inaugurated the "1917: Dr Besant's Impact on Indian Society" exhibition at the Adyar Museum on 31 December, and chaired the inaugural session of the 126th Indian Section Convention on 1 January at the Adyar Theatre. She gave the inaugural address on "Working Towards the Future" at the TOS Summer camp held at the Bhowali Himalayan Centre from 29 to 31 May. Dr Padhi also attended the General Council meeting and Strategic Planning sessions in Naarden, and participated in the 11th World Congress in Singapore, delivering a talk on "Consciousness, Compassion, and Contemplation". She was a

participant in the 4th TOS International Conference which followed the World Congress and made a presentation on "Women's Empowerment" — a project of TOS, Odisha.

In March and April, the Secretary of the TS, Ms Marja Artamaa, gave a total of three talks in Adyar: At the TOS South Zone Conference, on "Service through Will, Wisdom, and Love"; at the South India Conference, the welcome address; and at the Gandhinagar Lodge, another talk on "Advantages of Lodge Meetings". In May she went to the Bhowali Centre with three others to inaugurate the TOS Indian Camp. She also attended the General Council meeting and planning sessions at the ITC, Naarden, in early July and the World Congress in Singapore in early August. As Chief Guest in the Nalbari District of the Assam Federation, she gave the Usha Deka Memorial Lecture, "All Is One in the Light of Theosophy" on 23 September, and the next day she visited the Lodges of the same Federation in Guwahati.


The Treasurer of the TS, Ms Nancy Secrest, gave the inaugural address in celebration of Annie Besant's birthday on 1 October at Advar. where, at the end of March, she was also Chief Guest at the TOS South Zonal Conference this year, speaking about the importance of service in our lives. She also spoke on Yoga Day at the Olcott Memorial Higher Secondary School (OMHSS), Adyar. At the end of May she travelled to the TS Centre in Bhowali, where a TOS Camp was being held. As the Chief Guest, she spoke about theosophical education. In early July she also attended the General Council meeting and Strategic Planning sessions in Naarden. At the World Congress in Singapore, this time as International Secretary of the TOS, she gave an overview of TOS activities worldwide and led the 4th International TOS Conference immediately following the World Congress. In late August she went to Pumpkin Hollow, a theosophical centre north of New York City, where she participated in a joint session with Mr Michael Gomes, Theosophical historian, on "Western Esotericism". A joint TS/ TOS event in Jaipur, India, immediately followed, where she again spoke on theosophical education.

This is the end of my report and I wish you all here present and around the world my very best wishes for a fruitful and harmonious Convention experience.

NEWS AND NOTES



Dr. A. Kannan (Dip. No. 38088) passed to peace on 3 January 2019. He became a member of the TS on 1 Feb. 1951 and was its Life Member since 19 Oct. 1979.

Dr. Kannan obtained a doctorate in Chemistry from Bombay University and had specialized in the chemistry of foods, drugs and water. He did his post-doctoral research on Dairy Chemistry at the University of Minnesota, St. Paul. Subsequently, he worked at the Dairy Institute, Bangalore and at the Delhi Municipal Corporation as a Public Analyst. In December 1964, he moved with his family to TS Adyar. In 1973, he started the Theosophy Science Study group and was its Convener till 2009. He was the Editor of 'Theosophy, Science and Yoga', the Bulletin of Theosophy and Science and the journal on Holistic Science. Was the author of the books, *Impact of Theosophy and Science* and *The One Life and Functional Forms*. He wrote several articles in various Theosophical journals.

As a National Lecturer, Dr. Kannan travelled throughout India for many years, conducting study classes and delivering lectures on the themes related to Theosophy. He was the General Secretary of the Indian Section of the T.S. for one year (1983). Along with T. S. work Dr. Kannan also attended to the work of the Esoteric School of Theosophy and Co-freemasonry. Besides, he was a member of the Besant Education Fellowship for several years.

Assam

A two-day study camp on "Mahatma Letters" was held at ATF

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meeting hall, Guwahati, on 14 and 15 Sept., 2018. It was directed by Bro. Pradip Kumar Mahapatra, former Joint G.S. Indian Section. Bharat Samaj Pooja was conducted on 14 September by Sis. Mitalini Mahapatra, Vice-President, Utkal Federation. It was conducted. Dr. Bipul Sarma, Bro. N.C. Dutta and Bro. R.N. Chowdhury took part in the camp as resource persons. On the second day Sis. Dr. C.P. Bhuyan and Sis. Mitalini Mahapatra spoke on the theme of the camp. The camp was attended by 35 participants and ended successfully.

Jnanpith Lodge, Nalbari, organized a public meeting where Bro. Pradip Kr. Mahapatra was the chief guest. Sis. Mitalini Mahapatra delivered a talk on 'Devotion'. Bro. P.K. Mahapatra participated in the A.G.M. of T.O.S. Assam, as Chief Guest. It was held on 18 September.

He delivered the main talk highlighting various aspects and contributions of Dr. Besant's life. Bro. N.C. Dutta presided and Bro. R.N. Chowdhury, Dr. C.P. Bhuyan, Bro. K.S.Lahkar Bro. K.C. Buragohain also spoke about Dr. Besant's dedication and contribution.

The members assembled in the meeting hall on the occasion of the Foundation Day and celebrated it enthusiastically. Bro. Dharmananda Bhagawati delivered the main talk. Significance of the day was explained by the Secretary and he paid homage to the Masters. Bro. N.C. Dutta presided over the meeting and highlighted various contributions of the founders. As it was the Foundation Day of Assam Theosophical Federation as well homage was paid to the dedicated founders and members of ATF. Bro. R.N. Chowdhury gave a detailed account regarding the birth of ATF and gave a vivid description of all the workers including the 7th International President Sis Radha Burnier who inaugurated the Federation's Office. He also paid homage to Sis Vinodini Goenka who donated a plot of land to ATF and worked for ATF whenever she came to Guwahati.

Annual Conference

The Annual Conference of ATF was organized at Pensioners' 82/THE INDIAN THEOSOPHIST, Feb./ 2019

Bhawan, Chandmari, Guwahati, on 18 November 2018. At 8:30 a.m. Federation's Flag was hoisted by the President Bro. N.C. Dutta. At 9-00 a.m. subject committee's meeting started under the presidentship of Bro. N.C. Dutta. Secy Dr. C.P. Bhuyan welcomed all and presented the annual activity report. Bro P.N. Das, Treasurer, presented the annual audited report. Both the reports were accepted after discussion. Annual Budget was also presented by the Secretary, which has already been sent to the National Office. It was also approved by the house. Reports from the lodges were presented by the Presidents/Secretaries of the respective lodges through which the success and the failure were projected. The strength and the weakness were discussed and the solution thereof were also suggested by the members. As per the advice of the President, the Secretary gave a brief account of the strategic planning and goal setting meeting held at Bhowali and proposed three nos of such meetings at three zones of Guwahati, Nalbari and Jorhat/Golaghat so that goal may be set and reach easily. Bro. Anil Kr. Barua, former Secretary, ATF, questioned about the transfer of name of the ATF office house and Bro. R.N. Chowdhury replied about the present situation of the house. A committee comprising of the present Secretary Sis. Dr. C.P. Bhuyan, Bro. R.N. Chowdhury, Bro. P.N. Das and Bro. A.K. Barua was formed to look into the matter and take necessary step if required. Bro. P.N. Das informed that although an advocate was engaged to look into the matter, he did not do anything.

In the post-lunch session the meeting started with the prayers of all religions. Welcome address was delivered by Bro. G.C. Deka, President of the reception committee. The Secretary read out the Greetings and the Good Wishes received from other Theosophical Federations of India. A bhajan was rendered by Sist. Chandana Buragohain. Bro. N.C. Dutta in his presidential speech spoke about Madam Blavatsky, her dedication towards the Theosophical Society and the trouble she took for the society. He gave reference of the work done by Srimanta Sankardev and Srimanta Madhavdev for Universal Brotherhood. The Chief Guest of the conference was Prof Dr. Amalendu Chakravorty, the Dean of Faculty, and HOD Guwahati University. He delivered a talk on "Sankardev and the Universal Brotherhood". He started his speech with the explanation of universal brotherhood. He explained nicely that the essence of universal brotherhood lies in Rig Veda itself. In course of time, the Varnasrama Dharma, the fourfold social organization, was weakened and became disordered by the uprising of the adharma, sin and vice. The organization shifted from" Karma" to "Janma." The message of universal brotherhood is there in every religion but in course of time it was wrongly explained by the followers to mislead the general puplic. The main enemy of universal Brotherhood is ego and elimination of ego is humanity.

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The annual journal edited by Sis. Nilima Das was released by Bro. R.N. Chowdhury. Another book on "Important Days to be observed by the Theosophical Society" (*Brahma Bidyar Palaniyo Tithibor*) published by the Federation was also released by him. A devotional song was presented by Sist. Lakhami Das. The president in his speech appealed to work for the propagation of theosophy and try to live theosophical life. He requested the members to devote more time for the work of the Theosophical Society. Vote of thanks was given by Bro. Kiran Ch. Buragohain. The conference concluded with Shanti Path lead by Bro. R.C. Dev Sarmah.

Bengal

Anniversary Programme: The 42nd Anniversary of Bharadwaja Theosophical Lodge was held on 30 September 2018, along with the 36th Annual Convention of TOS-West Bengal, at BTS Hall. Justice Shyamal Sen former Governor and Chairman of Human Rights Commission, Government of West Bengal, was the Chief Guest and Bro. Subrata Chowdhury- a Senior Advocate of Supreme Court of Bangladesh and a senior TS member was the Guest of Honour. Venerable Monk of SUSW Mission inaugurated the programme by lighting candle in front of the Photo of HPB and Dr. Annie Besant. Bro. Debabrata Bhattacharyya, Secretary of Tripura Histasadhini Sabha released a book entitled *Jignasha* Bro. Swarnabha Bala presided and conducted the meeting. In all, 130 TS & TOS members and teachers and students of TOS Schools attended the programme.

The meeting started with Payers of all Faiths followed by one minute silence, and then opening song by Sis. Joytsna Barman. While releasing the book Bro. Debabrata Bhattacharya said-"Enquiries help to obtain knowledge and wisdom through practice of that knowledge. This book will help the seekers of the Truth".

Bro. Amal Kirshna Mandal, Secretary, Bharadwaja Lodge, and Bro. Gangaram Bazra, Regional Secretary of TOS- West Bengal presented their annual reports. Secretaries of three TS Lodges and Seven TOS Groups who came from Sandeshkali Sundarban and Gangasagar were felicitated by offering "Uttaria" by the ten Teachers of TOS schools. Bro. B.L. Bhattacharya appreciated their service for those who are needy and those who suffer.

Fifty Teachers and 12 ex-students of TOS aided schools were awarded with financial help @Rs. 500/- each. Bro. Subrata Chowdhury expressed his satisfaction for getting opportunity to attend such a beautiful programme at Kolkata. He explained how the work of TS is growing in Bangladesh. Justice Shyamal Sen in his short and illuminative

lecture said- "we are passing through crisis. We need a leader like Dr. Annie Besant and Brotherhood of the Theosophical Society is most relevant in the modern world".

A purposeful Souvenir was published to commemorate this occasion and copies were given to all the participants. Bro. Avik Guha Thakurata thanked all those who extended their helping hands to make this programme a success. The meeting ended with National Anthem conducted by Sis. Chandana Nandi and followed by all. Sister Arati Nandi, Bro. A.N. Chakraborty, Bro. Ratan Das, Secretary BTS, Bro. Malay De, Bro. Swapan Bhai, Bro. Mihir Saha and Bro. Debesh Chowdhury played important role to make the programme a success.

A three-day study camp was organized at BTF, Kolkata, from 18 Nov to 20 Nov. 2018. Bro. U.S. Pandey, National Lecturer, conducted the study. Topics discussed were-1. Man is his own maker, 2.Occult function of some human organ, 3. Chain, Rounds and Races. After the welcome address by the Federation Secretary Bro. Achintya Nr. Chakraborty, the study camp was formally inaugurated by Bro. Pankaj Kumar Dutta, President of Bengal Federation, Then, Bro. B.L. Bhattacharya, National Director, TOS, spoke about the importance of such study camps and requested Bro. Pandey to start the lectures on topic 'Man is his own maker'. Bro. Pandey explained the process of making oneself by one's thoughts and feelings during the earthly life and converting of these thoughts, feelings and faculties, etc. to the next life. In this context he extensively quoted the relevant matter from the Upanishads, Mahatma's Letters, The Secret Doctrine and the writings of Annie Besant. On the second day, Bro. Pandey spoke on 'Occult functions of some human organs' which evinced keen interest from the audience. He explained how our emotions affect health of various organs and conversely health condition of these organs affect our emotion, the role of Pineal and Pituitary gland besides occult functions of brain, ear, spleen, stomach and blood cells, and the role of kundalini force, etc.

The topic "Chains, Rounds and Races" was taken up by Bro. Pandey on the last day of the camp. He explained centenary nature of evolution, seven chains of earth, each chain having seven globes on different planets, seven root races of human beings and Law of Karma. Before concluding the camp, Bro. Achintya Nr. Chakraborty, Secretary, BTF, thanked the speaker and the participants.

Bombay

The 87th Annual Session of Bombay Theosophical Federation was held on 26, 27 & 28 October 2018, and was graced by Dr. Deepa Padhi,

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International Vice-President, TS, as the Chief Guest. The theme of the Session was 'Consciousness, Compassion, Contemplation'.

The Annual Session was opened at Blavatsky Lodge TS on Friday 26 October 2018 with Lighting of the Lamp and recitation of the Prayers of All Religions & the Universal Prayer. BTF's President Bro. Vinayak Pandya welcomed all and introducing the Chief Guest said that Dr. Deepa Padhi, Retired Professor of Philosophy, with Fellowship from University Grant Commission of India, had got her D.Lit. Degree for research on "Live and Let Live – An Analytical Study in Holistic Ethics'. She has authored books on 'The Ethical Philosophy of the Bhagvadgita' and with women's issues on 'Yes, She Can'. She is a second generation Theosophist from Bhubaneswar, is the President of TOS Odisha and now is International Vice-President of TS.

The greetings received from the International President Mr. Tim Boyd and other Dignitaries & Federations were read out by the Secretary Sis. Mahazaver Dalal. Sis. Deepa Kapoor, Director of TOS in Tanzania conveyed the greetings of Dar-es-Salaam Lodge, Africa, in person.

The Chief Guest Dr. Deepa Padhi in her Inaugural Address speaking on 'Self Transformation through Wisdom, Compassion and Contemplation' said: One absolute Consciousness – the One Reality with its breath has become subject to time & space, i.e. Purusha & Prakruti. Everything is in One Consciousness and Individual Consciousness is a means to reach the highest consciousness - realization of Oneness of Life. Universal Brotherhood springs up with understanding of Wisdom and highly developed emotions of Compassion. Compassion is Law of Laws – Love Eternal. It is beyond separateness and selfishness. One should treat every form of life, even flora & fauna and animals also with compassion. Contemplation is a continued attention of mind to one subject with commitment. It should be an uninterrupted flow of mind to perceive One Reality. It starts as a practice leading to experiences and terminating with union with God. on 17 November in which Bro. B.K. Pandey and Bro. Pramil Dwivedi spoke about the purpose of founding the society and the work done by the founders.
