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ASTEP FORWARD

Faith can be defined as having complete confidence or trust in a person or a thought. Faith is that distant light that still keeps us moving even when the circumstances and surroundings seem to fall apart. When one has faith and keeps practicing with hard work, courage and determination, there is nothing that can stop him from realizing what he had faith in.

Faith helps in keeping a person's aim clear to one's self. It helps one to focus on the destination by not being deterred by the hardships that come on one's way. When an individual feels enlightened and does not lose heart in a moment of hopelessness, that is the state when one has true faith.

Great men and saints have lived their lives challenging the mainstream and stereotypes. They have accomplished tasks and missions that ordinary men were far from achieving. It was their faith, hope and belief that helped them achieve all this. Freedom fighters have faith in their country and themselves and have won great battles. This faith has also helped them in not getting disheartened when they have encountered failure. A doctor has full faith in his abilities that gives him the strength to cure his patients.

Even in the epics, there are examples of great characters like Shri Krishna, who won the battle against evil forces with his faith in goodness and fairness. Swami Vivekananda is another example of great men who practised and preached the power of faith to people so that they may be able to come out of the uncomfirtable and

unpleasant situation. Mother Teresa had faith in humanity and brotherhood- and she kept serving the poor and sick selflessly. All this shows that faith is the mother of success and force of life.

The Buddha speaks of five faculties through whose means an ignorant ordinary man may emerge from ignorance to right understanding, and so from suffering to its cessation. They are faith, energy, mindfulness, concentration and understanding. The Buddha speaks of faith as one of the 'Seven Noble Treasures', one of the 'Seven True Ideas', one of the 'Five Factors of Endeavour', as an 'Idea on the Side of Enlightenment', as a 'Fount of Great Merit' and as one of the 'Three forms of Growth' which brings five advantages.

Faith begins to appear as a fusion of two elements- confidence and what the confidence is placed in. Faith as confidence is often described as a clearing of the mind, like water cleared of suspended mud by a chemical called 'Alum', or like a boat's launching out from the near bank to cross a flooded area in order to reach the other side of the river. When faith is aided by concentration, the mind launches out to its object and acquires confidence, steadiness and decision. Now something may have faith well placed in it, and yet it may be hollow, empty and false. Again, something may have no faith placed in it and yet it may be factual and true. So a wise man should never say, "only this is true."

It is commonly felt and often stated that faith is a weakness, a mere substitute for knowledge and a blind belief in dogma. But the point overlooked is that there is an element of faith in every conscious act. However, if you see the case of death, it is an obvious fact. No one will say that it is my faith that I will face death. Now one can have faith in that life will not continue after death or that life of some sort

continues after death. Whichever of the two one adopts is a matter of pure faith.

Faith dictates how one views life. With it, faith can make one's whole outlook positive. Without it, one's view will be clouded with negativity. It helps one reach any goal he puts his mind to. If one believes that he can achieve something, he will achieve it. On the other hand if one does not have faith in himself, he will never reach those goals. Without faith one would have nothing to look forward to, and life would be an interminable bore. Having faith in oneself about growing spiritually is certainly a step forward in his life.

The unity of every faith that loves God and serves man, that is the message which comes to the world as the inner purpose of the Theosophical movement: to draw all faiths together, to see them all as sisters, not as rivals, to join all religions in one golden chain of divine love and human serive; to reverence and serve religion wherever we find it, and to pierce through the varieties of the outer fiath to the unity of the hidden life.

YOUTH & THE ADYAR SCHOOL OF THE WISDOM

AS international President of the Theosophical Society (TS) I had a special interest in the Young Theosophists (YT) gathering in June of this year at the International Theosophical Centre in Naarden, the Netherlands. Having witnessed the recent resurgence of the YT movement, I looked forward to meeting and sharing with this group. Of the 31 who attended I had met a few over my years of TS travels. Coming from 16 different countries they were a diverse group with a variety of interests and experiences. It was fascinating to watch this group come together, each with their own unique background, with the Ageless Wisdom and its application as the binding factor.

Prior to June 3 almost everyone was new and unknown to each other. By the time they were leaving, five days later, tears were shed on parting from their new sisters and brothers. A great deal of energy and focus was placed on Theosophy and the role of the TS, but the real benefit of the gathering was the friendships that formed among young people searching for ways to grow and to serve. For some those bonds may be fleeting, but others have met brothers and sisters on the path with whom they will be working for years to come. I came away filled with great hope for the YTs and for the TS.

Whether young or not so young, we are creatures of habit and find ourselves repeating things: waking up in the morning, everyone has their process. Probably the regimen we did today is the one we did yesterday, and the day before. Every day most of us take at least a brief moment to look at ourselves in the mirror, and the face we see today we believe is the face we saw yesterday, and the day before. Our patterns during the course of a normal day repeat themselves. So

time after time we find certain expectations arising in our minds, of what this day is, of who we are, of what our capacities are, based on what they have been yesterday. Then we come to the School of the Wisdom in Adyar, Chennai, India.

Frequently we come with at least the background hope that something we find will be different, that there is something about the teacher, or the place, or the information that will alter something fundamental within us and open up new horizons. Whether or not it is openly voiced, it is on our mind. Then we find ourselves here with the facilitator, always one that is capable in the area that they present. We sit and we listen.

The theosophical work comes under the heading of the Ageless Wisdom tradition. The "ageless" part of it should not be forgotten. It is as fresh as this new day, every day. It is ever-renewed and ever-present. There is only one thing that is required of us. When we hear "only one thing" it always points to something that sounds as if it is simple; and perhaps that is because it is, in fact, simple; but "simple" does not mean "easy". The only thing that is required of us to experience the newness, the freshness we desire, is even a momentary lapse in the barriers of habitual expectation that we erect around ourselves. The only thing that prevents a light from shining into a room is that the door or the window is closed. The opportunity for them to open is ever-present.

In these moments when we are here together, we have a very special opportunity. Where are we? We are seated at Adyar, and what is that? In many ways it is just another point on the map, a spot of earth that if you look at a map could be identified. Lines could be drawn around it defining where it is and how we can find it, as with every spot of earth on the planet. This one has a very particular nature, as does every spot on the planet. But this one also has a particular history that has been embedded in the land on which we stand in

many ways. It has been called "The Masters' Home".

Adyar is a place where great people have had profound experiences of connection to this Ageless Wisdom, and have then been able to communicate their experience to the world in their behaviours, writings, speech, art, in all the ways that they express across the spectrum of their relationships. Wisdom has been able to pervade their being. So when we come here to a School of the Wisdom, this is the wisdom that we seek, the wisdom that is ever-present if allowed to be unobstructed. The words that we will hear will have great meaning if we allow for the capacity to hear.

In various scriptural texts it is said that stones can preach sermons to those who have the ears to hear. Do we have those ears? Is our hearing sufficiently unobstructed? In every moment, wherever we are, it is true that the place where we stand, the ground on which our feet are planted is holy ground. Here it is especially clear because we do not have the sounds of honking horns, or the constant movement of crowds that we encounter in cities, so it is a little bit more obvious. The place where we stand at any moment, any place in the world, is holy ground if we can realize it. Here more so, because in this particular moment that we call the School of the Wisdom, the intention is to become present in this way. There are many of us, so we magnify that intention, and we create a possibility. It is up to us what we do with it, how we treat it.

So, again, I would encourage each and every one of you, and especially young Theosophists, to make the most of this opportunity. This moment does not repeat itself—none do. So while we have it, let us appreciate it. Then we will be able to carry it on and pass on our exposure to wisdom—a wisdom that exceeds the words we will hear and the concepts we will come to understand.

DR. ANNIE BESANT: THE DIAMOND SOUL

A diamond has many facets, or geometric shapes. The diamond looks bright, colourful and rich from any side and every side. Dr. Annie Besant is one such person, with so many facets, and on each facet we can perhaps write a volume. So many words have been used to describe her and her achievements in various fields. Is it possible to describe what all she stood for, the values for which she lived, using our limited vocabulary. We have to look into or hear from the persons, who wrote about her and spoke about her. In the years of Nineteen sixties, (i.e. 1960 to 1969) there were quite a few who were living at Adyar, who have actually had the opportunity of working with Dr. Annie Besant. We can recall the names of persons like Bro. N. Sri Ram who was the international President of the Theosophical Society from 1953 to April 1973, we had the presence of Smt. Rukmini Devi Arundale; we had Bro. K. N. Ramanathan the then General Manager of the Theosophical Publishing House; we also met Sri B. Shiva Rao who was a leading journalist and Parliamentarian from Mangalore. we had the presence of persons like Bro. Baleforce Clarke, Bro. Yagnesware Sastry, and a few others. During their speeches or during their casual interactions, they shared lot of their impressions, their experiences, they had with Dr. Annie Besant. Bro. Nilakanta Sri Ram, whom many knew as Bro. N. Sri Ram, was the fifth International President of the Theosophical Society. He as a youngster worked in various capacities with Dr. Annie Besant. Dr. Annie Besant started many schools and colleges. Bro. Sri Ram was picked up by Dr. Annie Besant, and under her guidance worked at the Besant Theosophical

When Dr. Annie Besant started the Home Rule Movement, Bro. Sri Ram, joined her band of workers, and he volunteered to lecture on the Principles of Home Rule, and he also gave lectures on Theosophy. Besides, Bro. N. Sri Ram was active in the Labour Union Movement as well which was started by Dr. Annie Besant. She was demanding proper working conditions, and demanded humane treatment, when the poor Indian labourers were exploited. Bro. Sri Ram was the Assistant Editor of the daily newspaper, "New India" for which Dr. Besant was the Editor and Publisher. Bro. Sri Ram said, that he learnt many valuable things while working with Dr. Besant. He acknowledged that his talent as a writer and editor developed under the guidance of Dr. Annie Besant. At Dr. Besant's school he learnt that the superstitions, customs, and conventions had to be given up. Whatever was not in agreement with the Principles of Theosophy, all those were to be dropped. He dropped the suffix of Sastry, which indicated that he was a Brahmin by birth. Bro. Sri Ram embraced the Universal religion, Theosophy. He was inspired to adopt theosophy as a way of life. Dr. Besant trained him in all aspects of life. He said in

College at Madanapalle, then at National College Bangalore, and Madras. The schools, and colleges were started as part of nation-wide movement, of resurrecting India, through education. Mrs Besant awakened youth to their heritage and reminded them, and inspired the youth, to realize the responsibilities and their duties as future free citizens of India. Many youth during those times, both men and women, threw up their plans, they had otherwise, and worked with Dr. Besant for true renaissance and spirituality of their Motherland, Bharat, the India, which was reeling under the British rule. Bro. Sri Ram was inspired by her presence, and her talks, and without bothering about the so-called worldly success, followed the footsteps and directions of Dr. Besant.

one of his talks at Adyar that when Dr. Besant gave a lecture, there used to be so many points to make note of and implement them in life. One could notice that a simple life, generosity, humaneness, sympathy, were there in her way of living and as he mentioned his Guide and Benefactor practiced them in her life. Bro. Sri Ram used to say, letting go - renouncing, detachment gives and carries one to Bliss. He used to talk about how Dr. Besant gave everything she had, to those who needed it. He emulated Dr. Besant and said that he learnt that in *giving* there is lot of *happiness*. Though he had few possessions, he gave away, when he found some one else needed it more than him. The choice of words to drive the exact shade of meaning, he learnt from Dr. Annie Besant. Every person who came into contact with her felt that he was the closest to her. That was the kind of Love and affection, she showered on others. Bro. Sri Ram used this expression that Dr. Annie Besant licked them into shape.

Next, we will consider, how, Smt Rukmini Devi Arundale was inspired by Dr. Annie Besant. She came under the influences of Dr. Annie Besant when her father built a home, near the International Headquarters of the Theosophical Society, Adyar. Thanks to Dr. Annie Besant, Smt Rukmini got introduced to various forms of Music, Dance, and Culture. Dr. Annie Besant, was one, who gave the details of the rich Indian Culture to Smt Rukmini Devi. The revival of Bharat Natyam- cleansed the dance form, which was beset with overdose of *Sringara rasa* and Erotic elements. Along with her husband Bro. George S. Arundale, she started two institutions. In the year 1934, in memory of Dr. Annie Besant, she started a school, the Besant Theosophical High School at Damodar Gardens of the Theosophical Society. Dr. Annie Besant expressed a wish at the time of her death that a school, a running institution as a memory should be established.

She was not for putting up statues or monuments. Dr. Besant wished, that a school be established where the child will be educated without fear. Smt. Rukmini Devi declared, that the school she started stood as a memorial to Dr. Annie Besant. She took personal interest in the development of that school. In the year 1936, truly inspired by Dr. Annie Besant, she started 'Kalakshetra; a Centre for Performing Arts, based on traditional values where Music, Carnatic Music, and Bharatnatyam were taught. Smt. Rukmini Devi used to say that the suggestions of Dr. Annie Besant were very meaningful and powerful, as good as law. Besides, Smt. Rukmini Devi mentioned that how persons were identified based on the ray to which they belonged, and were encouraged to take up such activities which will develop them into well balanced personalities. The compassion which Smt. Rukmini Devi had for all living beings, was the direct result of observing with what care, love, and compassion, Dr. Annie Besant displayed to all living beings. Dr. Besant knew how to use the good qualities in all, for the development of the Society and Nation in general. Smt. Rukmini Devi used to say, whatever she has achieved in her life, much was due to the guidance, inspiration and direction she had received from Dr. Besant, and Bro. G.S. Arundale. A marriage which took place between a traditional Brahmin girl, and the British Born Theosophist George Sydney Arundale, was with the Blessings of Dr. Annie Besant.

Bro. K.N. Ramanathan, before taking up the assignment of the General Manager of the Theosophical Publishing House, was the General Manager of the Press Trust of India. He was living at Adyar from the year 1962. In one of the talks delivered on the occasion of Dr. Besant's birthday, Bro. K.N. Ramanathan gave so many personal details of his interaction with her, as a student. He too opined that he learnt a lot from her about the Art of writing and editing. Watching her

work regarding the Daily Newspaper 'The New India' Bro. K.N. Ramanathan detailed, about how Dr. Annie Besant trusted people. She loved them, the people as they are and she inspired them to change, she did not force anyone to change. Bro. Ramanathan mentioned that Dr. Annie Besant used to say if one finds the need to change he would do that, not because someone asked him to change. Bro. K.N. Ramanathan was in tears when he narrated an incident. There was an employee who was handling cash in one of the departments of the T.S. Estate. But, one day, when his superior verified the cash he found that the exact amount of the money was not there. So, the matter was reported to the President. Dr. Annie Besant was asked to remove him from his job. After asking everybody else to leave the room, Dr. Besant talked to the employee as to what led him to do it. The said employee, in tears, fell at her feet and accepted that he took the money and used it for meeting an urgent domestic need. Dr. Besant found out that this person was having problem in running the family, and the employee pleaded for mercy. She called her personal attender, to call, the head of the department, and then instructed that Head of Department to employe this person, where there problems regarding the cash amount was located. Dr. Besant, took care of employee's children's educational expenses. Such was the trust, such was the love and compassion, she showed to that person, who otherwise would have lost his Job. She used to say that if we go on removing persons from jobs, for their faults, or even grave errors, we will not have anyone to serve the various departments on the T.S. Estate.

Sri B. Shiva Rao was a journalist and a parliamentarian. He gave the 'Besant Lecture' in one of the Annual Theosophical Convention at Adyar. Thanks to his Elder Brother Sri Sanjiva Rao, he met Dr. Annie Besant who was actively advocating the Home Rule at that point of

time. Bro. Shiva Rao joined the Newspaper New India edited by Dr. Anne Besant Bro. Shivarao joined the Newspaper as its sub-editor in the early part of the year of 1917. He was inspired by Dr. Besant, to dive headlong into the Home Rule Movement and so he started attending the meetings, gave talks on the subject of Home Rule at various places in the present Karnataka-then called Mysore. He was a distinguished journalist and was elected to parliament on number of occasions. Sri B. Shiva Rao said that he learned his skills as a journalist and as a speaker in Public Forums, by reading Dr. Besant's Editorials, and listening to her speeches at Gokhale Hall, in the American street, in Madras, Bro, Shiyarao recalled the details of Dr. Besant's Oratorial skills. The Last syllable of each word was audible to the person sitting in the last row. Bro. Shivarao also said that the Gokhale Hall was built by Dr. Annie Besant, and that was the building in which she started the Home Rule League Movement. She donated the building to the citizens of Madras. Dr. Annie Besant also started the Young Men's Indian Association an organization dedicated to the development of the youth of Madras. She got constructed an impressive building and gave it to that organization. The YMIA Building is at Royapethah, in Madras. She said that YMIA was to serve the purpose of a political gymnasium as it were to equip the youth with a strong body and an informed mind of a noble character. Bro. B. Shivarao, recalled the significant contribution, she made in the field of Education, Bharat Scouts and Guides, and she fought for freedom for India and Indians, by raising her voice against British rule.

We also had Bro. Balfoers Clarke, an Englishman, a qualitied engineer who lived in the campus. He was closely associated with the up keep of the Maintenance Department of the T.S. Estate, which was spread over 300 acres of Land. One day Dick, said (Nick name

of Bro. Balfoers Clarke), she called him, and asked him to assist Krishnaji, to learn cycling. She was full of compassion, Love, and Possessed Powers to Heal People, said Dick.

In the preceding paragraphs an attempt has been made to present the views and impact of Dr. Annie Besant on the life and work of five prominent persons. They narrated them on different occasions. Dr. Annie Besant inspires us even today. As she mentioned in her autobiography ...I ask no other epitaph on my tomb but "SHE TRIED TO FOLLOW TRUTH."

If a comrade be fiathless, let us be faithfull to him;

If an enemy injure, let us forgive him;

If a friend betray, let us stand by him;

Then shall the Hidden God in us shine forth.

TOS< Mumbai Region Secretary Sis. Parinaz Gandhi conducted the meeting and introduced the speakers.

Sis. Mani Mullan inspired dedication to Nar Asho Jamshed Mehta with singing Bhajan 'Jhankho Jhankho Divo Maro joje bujay na'.

Blavatsky Lodge's Vice-President Bro. Navin Kumar said that Jamshed Mehta regarded 'Work as his Tonic'. Bro. Navin read out a note Jamshed Mehta had written to his friend saying that Zoroastrianism does not permit Non-Vegetarian food. Jamshed Mehta was elected ten times as Mayor of Karachi and was 'The Builder of Modern Karachi'. So the second prominent road in Karachi after Jinnah is in the name of Jamshed Mehta. Mahatma Gandhi had invited him to join Indian Liberation Movement and had said, 'Jamshed Mehta is accepted as the truest man of Karachi and one of the best representatives of Theosophy'. Jamshed Mehta was Member of Legislative Council of Theosophical Society and was open in giving his views politely when he differed. Sharing Tributes of other personalities, Bro. Navin said that 'Real tributes to Jamshed Mehta will be learning from his life to imbibe Theosophical values'.

Guest Speaker Ms. Shernaaz Engineer, Editor of *Jame-e-Jamshed Weekly* said: Jamshed Mehta embodied enlightened leadership. He put service before self. He felt that politics would not be suitable for the kind of life he lead. He was a visionary. He lived a Righteous Life and stood up for Truth. He spoke the truth and stood up for truth at all times. One should learn from his life, which was to serve a higher purpose.

Chief Guest Ms. Dilnavaz Variava has family connections with Bro. Jamshed and his family. She was 8 years old when he passed away, but he has been part of her everyday life and considers it as Blessings from Divine. He had an illustrious career. *He was epitome*

of Karma, Bhakti and Gyan Yogi. He transcended his own ego to be an instrument of the Divine. He transformed the lives of so many people. Municipality was his temple to discharge his work. Very humble. When people wanted to have his statue as the Builder of Modern Karachi, he pursuaded people to have the Statue of the First Mayor of Karachi. With life of Spirituality, Service & Sacrifice, he declined to be a part of any Political party. The fact that he is being remembered 70 years after his demise is that he was righteous, courageous, loving and compassionate and able to influence so many persons and used to be there for family and people for solution to their problems.

Jamshed Mehta believed that India needed not only political but also economic independence. Hence, he persuaded and helped Dilnavaz' father to start a business in Karachi in 1922 which employed many people and even provided medical facilities and midday meals to the workers at a time when labour laws were non-eminent.

Like Lord Buddha's teachings he practiced Right Livelihood. He also embodied the teachings of three important Zoroastrian Prayers - Ashem Vohu, Yatha Ahur Vairo & Yanghe Hatam. Pursuit of hard work and excellence was part of their family 's ethos. Giving back to Society instead of pursuing wealth for its own sake was an integral part of their upbringing. Courage in adversity was also put into practice. This happens when one works for a higher goal without complaining. Jamshed Mehta was like a 'Lotus', i.e. he lived in world but was not attached to world.

Sis. Parinaz Gandhi proposed the Vote of Thanks. The Commemoration Meeting ended with song written by Ketayun Patel with music by Navroz Mehta and sung by Jamshed Kotwal: "Satya Nishtha, Satya Premi Tu, Avo Nar Tu Jamshed Mehta!"

propositions as given in *The Secret Doctrine*, interpretation of, allegories and symbols so as to shed illuminating light on the scriptures, Three objects of the Society, Significance of the Universal Brotherhood, Three Great Truths and their explanations and importance, Death and its necessity for the soul in unfolding more and more powers through a series of reincarnation guided and regulated by Law of Karma, divine ethics, Fundamental Unity at all levels, Inadequacy of knowledge of modern science, Etheric force to come in future, Importance and Effects of the nature of good or bad thoughts of human beings, Need for people of all religions to go back to original pure teachings of their respective religions, etc. The audience evinced keen interest in the content of the talk and post talk. Besides, there was close interaction with the audience for another hour on many important points. Bro. Pramil Dwivedi, Secretary of Dharma lodge Lucknow who accompanied Br. Pandey, assisted in distributing few copies of the journal 'The Indian Theosophist' and also copies of two pamphlets concerning theosophy among the audience.
